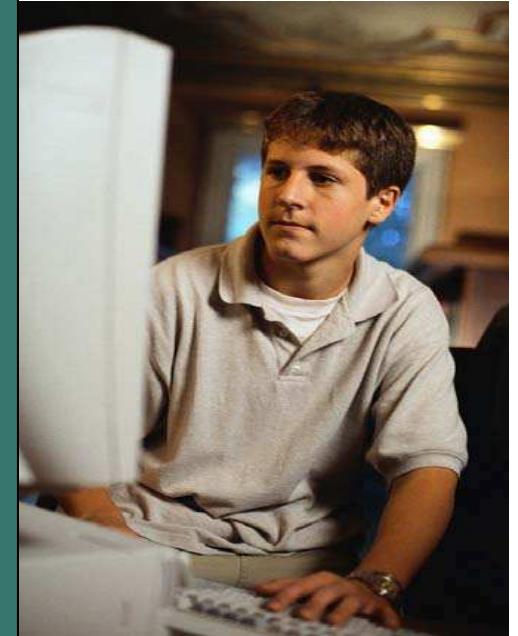

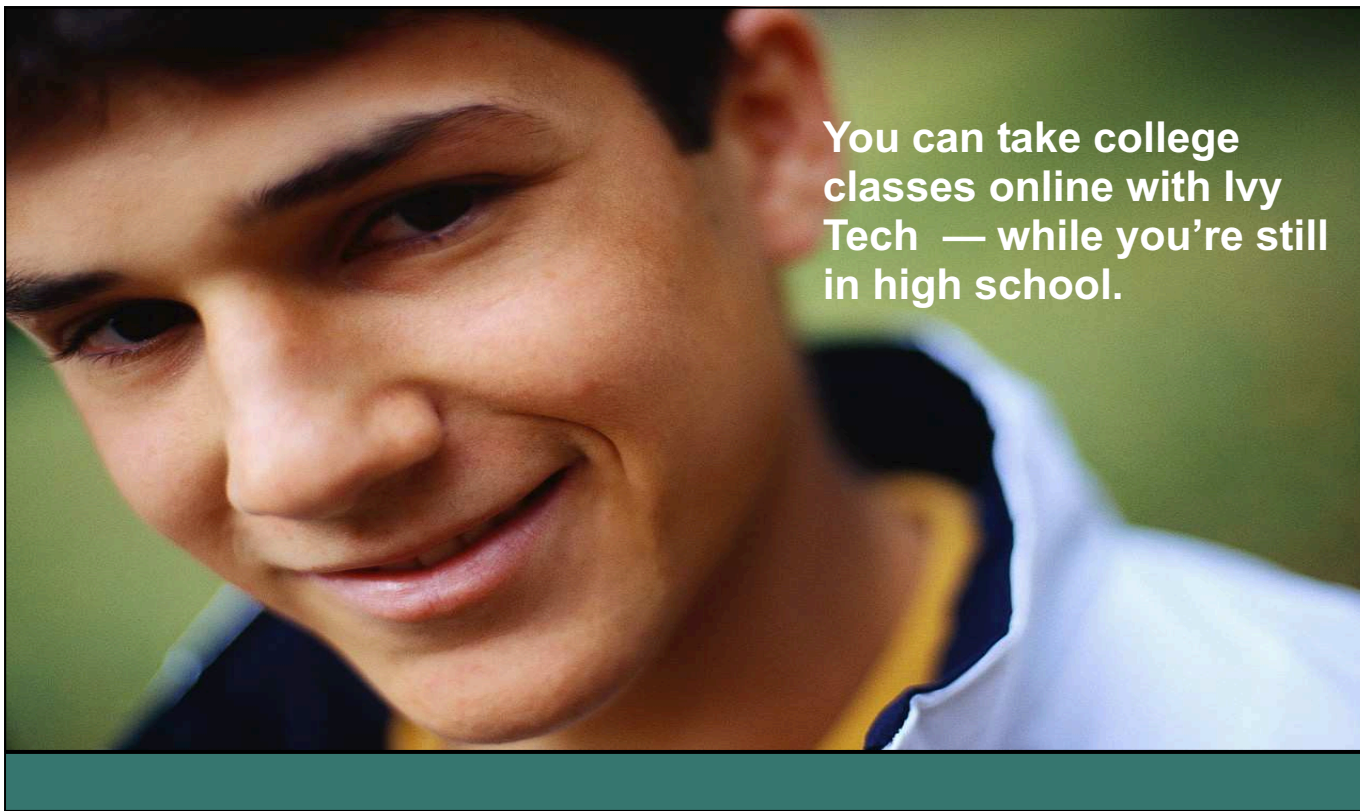

How to Apply

- Contact the Distance Learning office at (219) 981- 4448 or 1-888-IVY-LINE
- Complete an Ivy Tech application.
- Complete a skills assessment. Students seeking credit must meet course prerequisites and complete a basic skills assessment called COMPASS, a computer-based evaluation that measures your skills in reading, writing and math.
- Pay your tuition fees. Fees should be paid at the business office, the bursar's office or with the cashier. You also may pay your fees by phone or online.
